I hope families will be taking advantage of the new "Sunday School" options that are now available. Thanks to the Faith & Wisdom Committee and their hiring of new Sunday School Director, Creighton Helms, Sunday morning faith education is being rebooted to help meet the needs and interests of today's families. Parents, there is now an "Adult Forum" every Sunday, so you have somewhere to go after dropping off your child. The current series is called, "Faith & Healing," with a guest medical professional every week. There are also opportunities to volunteer within the Sunday School program. It's important to me that we have adult involvement on Sunday mornings, since in most cases, children and youth are dependent on them for transportation.

For our Youth, we are having an ongoing series of talks I call, "Faith Walk." We try to create a safe space to explore and talk about our individual Faith journeys, and how issues, events and circumstances in "the real world" affect or are affected by our beliefs and values. The goal is to give our youth confidence to talk about their faith and reduce anxiety and discomfort related to expressing themselves in spiritual matters. At the same time, we try to find out what the Bible might say, and what the ELCA Lutheran perspective is. Yes, it won't be an easy task - we have enough trouble getting adults to speak openly, right? - but it's a start. Our session is a little shorter - still starting at 9:30am but ending around 10am, since some of us will be involved with running the church service.

Please plan on attending the next JOLT! Sunday on November 5th. It will be a special All Saints Sunday, for sure: Some of our "Glump Grads" will be confirming their faith with special presentations. The Sunday School children will "flip the script" and be the ones to lead Kids' Time (in addition to kicking us off with a rousing rendition of "Oh When The Saints Go Marching In!") We will, of course, have our annual "Roll Call of the Saints," remembering the year's baptisms and deaths. The JOLT! Worship team will be there to help us meditate, pray, worship and praise our good and faithful God.

Kitchen News: Story of a Dishwasher

As the newsletter deadline approached, I planned to write about how much the Immanuel building was used within our community. Reading the Our Town paper, it seemed that Immanuel was listed as a meeting site on every other page. Sharing our space, and often our kitchen.

Then last week the commercial dishwasher in our kitchen went ‘pop’ and failed to run. Dishes were washed the old fashioned way that day. Not the best solution from a food safety perspective.

Trustee Neil MacInnes happened to walk into the gym at the wrong time and volunteered to take a look at the problem. Additional on-site assistance was provided by Dave Miller. The popping persisted when the machine was turned on and would immediately shut down. A technical manual was downloaded from the internet and a national service phone number was located. We possessed a Model 10 AB made in Kentucky by Jackson Warewashing Systems.

Neil and Courtney spent a couple of hours Thursday on the phone with a variety of service repair-folk and a factory representative in Kentucky. Some didn’t work on this model, some didn’t service the Silverton area, some didn’t work on dishwashers at all.

They persisted and the news was encouraging. The serial number on our Jackson Model 10AB indicated it was made in the 1980’s. This was confirmed by several members who knew that our dishwasher had been salvaged from the last fire, with a decision to keep it rather than replace it in 1995.

And for good reason. Jackson dishwashers are designed to last a lifetime. They are ‘built like a tank’ in the words of a friendly and very knowledgeable service tech from the company.

Operation is achieved due to three motors using relays and switches as opposed to our typical household dishwasher that functions with failure prone computer boards. No computer parts on the Jackson.

Because the Model 10AB is still sold, the three motors are available as replacement parts. Each carries a price at about one to two thousand dollars. This is reassuring because a replacement Jackson Model 10AB now costs about \$18,000. to replace. Thank goodness they are built well.

At the time of this writing a repair person has arrived at Immanuel and determined our dear Jackson needs a new main tank heating element. It has been ordered. Hopefully it will arrive and be installed before the first of November. Stay tuned for final results!

In the end it is important to note that the Jackson dishwasher is probably the most durable appliance in the Immanuel certified kitchen. It would also be very expensive to replace.

If you use our kitchen, you may have seen new red signs around the dishwasher reminding people to turn off both the heater and the master switches when washing is completed. Twice in the prior month the heater and master were found left on.

It is very important to turn on the two switches in the proper sequence so that the heater element does not heat with no water in the tank.

Did this have anything to do with the ‘pop’ and failure? Or did our Jackson simply need some parts due to the wear and tear it receives? It certainly has been reliable.

And we hope that it continues to be reliable for a very long time.

And that is this month’s “Story of a Dishwasher”.
