### WHAT IS LENT?

*“Lent” is derived from the Middle English “Lente” which means “springtime.” It is the 40-day period of repentance and renewal preceding Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Easter Service.*

*Lent is a special time: for meditation, prayer, and penitential practices.  
increased understanding of Christ’s sacrifice and Resurrection.  
renewal of baptismal vows and recommitment to the Christian life.*

### WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

*The Lenten period allows us time to recall the Easter story and absorb its meaning. Christ lived and died to redeem the world from sin. Because of Christ’s death and Resurrection, our lives can be renewed: we can renounce sin and begin to live for God.*

## Did Ya Know?

Have you noticed signs on our two benches at church that say Friendship? Did ya wonder why those signs were added? The history of the Friendship Bench started in Zimbabwean when a psychiatrist lost a patient to suicide. They pioneered the Friendship Bench, a simple yet transformative idea: training grandmothers as lay counselors to provide accessible mental health support within their communities. This evidence-based model has since expanded globally, demonstrating that effective mental health solutions do not always require expensive clinics or specialized professionals; sometimes, they begin with a heartfelt conversation on a bench.
