*Just Pondering...*

When a teacher of the law asked Jesus, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?"

Jesus responded, "The most important one is this: Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these."

In this 'month-of-love', the word to each of us is to love God and to love our neighbor. Hopefully, the next question is 'how'. How do we love our neighbor? Well, and who is our neighbor?

Of course, when an expert in the law asked that same question, Jesus had a story for that too.

## Sound Improvement Committee by Mary Miller

It is with great pleasure the Sound Improvement Committee has chosen Design Sound NW to do the upgrades to our sound system.

The agreement was sent to them on 1/19/26 and the team from Design Sound came out on Tuesday, 1/20/26. They used their laser to get accurate measurements and a detailed review of the sanctuary to start the Ease 3D Modeling that will identify our sound improvement needs.

It will take about 4 weeks for them to analyze how to best address the needs of the hearing impaired and upgrade our sound system. When the final proposal is available it will go to Council for approval.

The project will not be started until after Easter to avoid interrupting Lenten and Easter services.

## Frosig Features

Happy New Year. Hope your Christmas was delightful and your new year is off to a great start.

Many people know that the 12 Days of Christmas are just not long enough for me. If you have driven past my house recently, you might have thought - Wow, this girl really does love Christmas. It's true, I do. I love the sparkle of the lights in the darkness, and Christmas just seems to bring Joy to the world.

Until a few days ago I had only taken down the garlands, red bows, and lights off the front of the porch. Now they are

spread out on the floor of the porch with the garlands and lights from the picket fence, around the front door, and the Christmas train. Now, the tallest of the three trees on the porch is decorated with snowflakes, and the snowman's welcome sign is still by the front door.

Surprise, inside the house it's still Christmas, too. Christmas Carols play from the Alexa in the kitchen. Christmas Hallmark movies play on the TV, and a few more Christmas cookies are in the freezer. Everything with a face is smiling because they are happy. Little bears line the back of the church pew, The Christmas village is still active with ice skating, sleds, and people strolling in the snow.

Joining Mary, Joseph, baby Jesus, angels, shepherds, wisemen, one camel, a donkey and lots of sheep at the nativity, are two sisters. One carries a birthday cake and the other a plate of cookies. Their elephant carries the present. A little girl brings flowers and a little boy has a frog in his pocket. A cow, a goat and two piggies want to come celebrate this little baby too. A boy plays the mandolin next to the Little Drummer Boy. An angel plays a horn saying 'Rejoice', and another boy with arms wide open declares 'Hallelujah'.

Then January came. With the brace off, it was time to tidy up this place and have some company during the rest of the 12 Days of Christmas. I had great plans. Overly ambitious plans maybe, but a girl's gotta do what a girl's gotta do when a girl's gotta do it. Another motto here.

I was feeling so accomplished for about three days, then BAM !!! Another one of those 'life's-curveballs' hit me right across my shoulder blades, and my back muscles went into a big twit. They were screamin mad and there went my best made plans.

I totally blame my brain for those two broken bones before Christmas and now these unhappy back muscles. Seems it has not accepted this 'Becoming of a Certain Age' part of life's journey that has been mentioned to me. It still thinks, we all get older with each birthday, so why should that stop me from doing what I have always done before? Lifting bins, pushing boxes, sweeping floors, carrying yard art to the shed. I am not old, just older. Lots of mottos here.

But life's curveballs often come with a lesson. Don't hop off a treadmill while it's moving. Slow down. Stop and think what being overly ambitious is doing to my body. Resting in recovery gets to be really boring when there are things to do. Short spurts of time at the computer, seeing the headlines, not a good idea. Sadness gets into my pondering, worry too. I feel the darkness. Then I need to reach for the light.

I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. John 8:12

Christmas lights, candle light, lantern light, Light of life. Joy, hope, love, peace. Family, friendship, community, strength. Flowers, laughter, warmth, belonging. All some of my favorite things.

"Be the Light. Love one another as I have loved you," Jesus said.

Oh, I have red snapdragons blooming in front of my porch. It's a miracle. Flowers tell us there is hope for the future. Happy Valentine's Day everyone.
