*Just Pondering...*

In January, my vacation included time in Rwanda, Kenya and Tanzania. National Parks, animals, people groups, experiences...it was a truly remarkable adventure. But, with that said, Rwanda stood apart in so many ways.

Our time in Rwanda had two themes, time trekking with the Mountain Gorillas (amazing!) and the 1994 genocide.

As told by our guides and the memorials we visited, a million Tutsis were murdered by their Hutu neighbors in 100 days during those bloody months of 1994. The back story includes the Germans, who first took over the country, alongside of the people of Belgium who stepped into the role of colonizers after the Germans lost the war.

At some point the Europeans created and perpetuated the separation of Tutsi and Hutu, as they attempted to categorize the native people by their physical attributes. Once the distinctions were created, jealousy and hatred could be fanned and stirred. Then, in 1994, when the conditions were ripe, there was a nationwide call to rise up and destroy the Tutsis. For over three months, that is exactly what happened.

I visited these places just thirty two years later. {To put it in perspective, my youngest daughter was born in 1994!} Three decades up the road, Rwanda has {and is} doing amazing work.

As a nation they have chosen a peace and reconciliation process that has healed wounds and relationships in ways that justice and prison alone cannot. If a perpetrator {aka murderer} is willing to confess and offer details about the attack and any information about locating the body/bodies, their sentences can be reduced. As a survivor, consider the power of knowing what happened, of the violator looking you in the eyes and speaking the truth, of that same person asking forgiveness.

Peace and Reconciliation villages have also been constructed. Survivors living beside the guilty parties. Included in this healing is the dissolution of the false categories of Tutsi and Hutu. The people of Rwanda will tell you they are one country, one people.

As astonishing as this recovery is, it is only part of the Rwandan story.

This is a country that has also spent these past decades working on conservation. As I told you, time with the Mountain Gorillas was part of my Rwanda experience. In the 1980's, the Mountain Gorilla population had dwindled to a couple of hundred, largely due to ongoing poaching issues. Today, the number is over 1,100. An incredible turn-around under any circumstance, but considering the humanitarian struggles of the nation, this recovery seems unimaginable.

We aren't finished yet. This land of resilient people is also accomplishing remarkable environmental feats. Green spaces. Water use. But honestly, to my tourist-eye, the lack of roadside trash was more than significant. It was unmarred beauty.

We are an Easter people, moving into the season of Easter ~ where life and hope are budding everywhere. And as I warmly recall my brief visit to Rwanda, I see other Easter peoples. Despite the death and mayhem that ravaged their land, they have leaned into peace, and life, and hope.

Friends, may it be so with us.

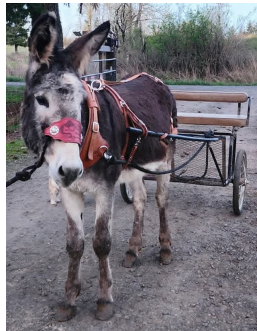

## Sound Improvement Committee by Mary Miller

The Sound System Committee, at the request of the Trustees, has been exploring options for updating our current system. We have had many conversations with design groups as we've worked through this process. Due to the unique design of our building, upgrading the sound system is not straightforward.

At this time, the proposed solution includes installing five speakers suspended from the beams that cross the sanctuary. The soundboard will also be updated, making it much easier to operate with minimal instruction. In addition, our projectors—now about 20 years old—will be replaced, as they are increasingly difficult to operate.

We also plan to install a new pulpit microphone, which will eliminate the current issue of feedback when it is turned on. New wireless and lapel microphones will be added as well. For those who are hearing impaired, a new assistive listening system will be available if the updated sound system does not fully meet their needs.

A display will be set up in the narthex to keep the congregation informed about fundraising progress. We will need to raise half of the total cost before signing a contract, with the remaining balance due upon completion of the project.

Members of the Trustees and the Sound System Committee welcome any questions you may have.

Thank you for your continued support as we move forward, worshiping together with a joyful sound.
