Just Pondering...

I got the call from the hospice nurse at 10:30 and walked into my mom's apartment by 11:30. She immediately recognized my voice; in the minutes ahead she would also respond to prayer and touch and encouragement. Early the next morning, at 12:15, she slipped into the tender arms of Jesus.

As part of my pastoral ministry, I have been present for the moment of death before. I don't think I was ever alone with the person going home...nor was it ever my parent. This event, the time beside my mother's bed was absolutely personal, precious and sacred.

It has been a dozen years since my father's death. I learned much about my mother over that span of time. However, over these last few weeks, I learned more. Or, perhaps I simply saw her in a new way, a different light.

Due to long term health issues, I have long perceived my mom as fragile and vulnerable. And she was. But walking this chapter beside her, I became aware of a fierce streak in my mother.

This is a woman who willingly stopped driving and sold her car. At the time I only saw the decision as a sign of her fragility. When she knew she needed extra help, she gave up her home and found an Assisted Living Apartment. Once again, I failed to see past the frailties that brought her to that place.

About six weeks ago, of her own accord my mom made an appointment to talk with hospice. Instead of chasing doctors and pills and ER visits, she boldly concluded it was time to stop the chasing. At long last, the scales fell from my eyes and I realized I was in the presence of a fierce woman. And let me tell you, she was fierce to the very end!

Mom died two weeks shy of her birthday. Knowing the end was coming near, some of her very dear relatives began planning for an early birthday bash. I'm certain my mother helped with the decision-making, since it was a group trip to one of her favorite places, Spirit Mountain Casino.

It seemed crazy pants {in a beautiful way} that these relatives were signing up to take her on this final great adventure, despite the level of care that was involved. They did it anyway. She put all of her remaining energy into the overnighter and had a ball.

It was just two days later that I got that late night call from the hospice nurse.

She who was fragile and vulnerable was also fierce. And I am her daughter.

Answers to frequently asked questions...

Why is the church upgrading our sound and projector system?

Our current system no longer meets the needs of our congregation. Many members have shared that they struggle to hear clearly in certain areas of the sanctuary, our musicians and speakers face challenges hearing each other. This upgrade is intended to improve clarity, intelligibility, consistency and accessibility for everyone.

The new system will solve the problems of “dead zones”, have consistent sound quality for speaking, music and support those with hearing impairments.

How will this improve the worship experience?

This upgrade will provide clearer sound throughout the sanctuary, ensuring every seat has a consistent listening experience. Allow musicians and worship leaders to hear and lead more effectively. Reduce distractions caused by technical difficulties. Create a more welcoming and inclusive environment for all.

What will the new system include?

The project includes new speakers designed for our shape of sanctuary, new microphones, mixing equipment (fancy words for sound board components), new projectors so the words can be seen more easily on the screens for an improved experience during worship.

How much does this project cost?

The total cost is \$121,112.38 for the equipment, professional design, installation and set up. A detailed breakdown of the costs are posted on the bulletin board in the gym. This project is funded entirely by specified donations. No monies from the general fund will be used for this.

We currently have 75% of the necessary funding. The contract has been signed for DSNW and a check for half of the total amount sent to them. They will order the equipment and work with the church for installation so this does not affect the services. Exact timing for installation depends on receiving equipment, and what our needs are. Any updates will be posted.

Is this good use of our resources?

The project was initially considered 15 years ago. In the last year, more concerns have been raised about the inability to hear well, with some congregants choosing to not come to church because they could not hear. The board of Trustees listened to the concerns, appointed a special board to evaluate options and bring forth a recommendation. Proposals were reviewed, and DSNW was chosen not only because their bid was similar in price but they also have installed the sound system at St. Paul's Catholic church here in town and our new town hall here in Silverton.

They provided the best overall solution for our space, balancing quality reliability and cost. Their design was based on a specialized computer program that specifically addresses the challenges in our sanctuary.

How can I support this project?

Funds that are designated for the project can be done through the QR code on the “speaker” bulletin board, or through direct donations designated for the sound system.

Pray for the success of the project.

Frosig Features

We began as little strangers, became friends for life it seems, and now we are treasures. I know how blessed I am to have had such a wonderful childhood in a great family, and a safe neighborhood just a little north of the city limits in NE Portland. I still have so many friends from that land we call childhood. Some of us are from the same neighborhood and church, all of us are from the same high school, some from both grade school and high school.

My mind wanders back to that land a lot these days, a great place to be a kid. Concerns were things like I hoped my key skates would stay clipped to my shoes, as I went flying down a hill with arms stretched straight out to the side. Or, is the basket on my bicycle going to hold everything I need today? But, when I wore my Dale Evans cowgirl outfit and my Roy Rogers hat, my bike was a Palomino horse like Trigger and I had no concerns.

Hopscotch and tether ball were my favorite games. Summers came with sunburns, feet with bee stings, and Sunday afternoon potlucks at the park in Silverton with Mom's cousins and classmates and church friends. Our

faces and hands got sticky from homemade popsicles, but wandering the shore of Silver Creek felt like magic. I knew this is where I would live someday.

Now, the real gift from childhood land has come. Those little strangers who became friends are now family. When we meet for lunch or an activity, we know how blessed we are to have been in that childhood land together. We tell the stories and share the memories and hug the hugs till we meet again.

And, I do live in Silverton.

We don't know when we meet a stranger, share a story, have a laugh together, if that will become one of those special moments when a stranger becomes a friend. Our words can become so meaningful even inspirational to someone else, and we may never know it. But whatever happens, it was a feel-good moment and joy was shared.

I was at the Elizabeth Hoke Foundation plant sale. Bought some wonderful things for my yard. I know about Elizabeth Hoke and what happened, but to my surprise the woman who was helping me with the plants was Elizabeth's mother. When she was putting my stuff out in the parking area where I could drive up and put it in my car, I had a chance to ask her about Elizabeth. And then I told her the story of our Nikki, the oldest of the Frosig grandchildren. She too was on her way to college, her third year at the University of Puget Sound. A drunk driver in a 1-ton pickup truck on cruise control passed out while driving at noon, crossed a median on I-5 and hit Nikki head on. She was 20 years old for one month.

There we were two strangers holding plants in a parking lot until we shared the same story, and she said, "Can I give you a hug?" It was one of those very special moments that just come.

I have been going to physical therapy for much of 2026 already. My upper back still suffers from a fall 5 years ago that healed improperly because I did not get to PT as soon as I should have. My therapist is a doctor of PT, so she has been teaching me so many things about my back muscles. She found that a rib under my left shoulder blade was being held out of place by a very tight muscle. Yikes.

Now, we both share a love of living in a house built in 1901, and the love of family history. When I told her I was a pastor's wife for 28 years, I found out she also has a degree in theology. Oh my, we also share the love of the Gospel according to Mary of Magdala, Mary Magdalene.

We were two strangers in a PT room, but now friends with so much in common. One of those special moments that just come.

And, I've just had a health screening at Silverton Hospital. When my nurse came into my little area, she was wearing hospital scrubs, her hair covered with one of those plastic caps, and her face with a mask. She pulled her mask down and said, "Hi, I remember you. We were in a plant store talking about daffodils."

I didn't recognize her as quickly with that mask on and her hair covered. It was Stephanie. We got to have some more time together and share more stories before I had to leave. Another one of those special moments that just come.

Even in a world so full of chaos that looks so peaceful when you see pictures of it from space, those special moments come unexpectedly. Gifts of joy and connection with someone who once was a stranger. I love it when that happens. The Lord has a plan, ya know. We just have to recognize it when it comes as a gift and a treasure.

Let your faith guide you on your journey, it leads the way.
