Frosig Features

I was ready. We were going to Agate beach.

On Sundays after church, it wasn't Mom we waited for, it was Dad. He was an usher and would stay after church to count the offering money. We would walk home without him, change out of our Sunday clothes, and then wait some more. Mom had our Sunday mid-day meal in the pressure cooker, so it was waiting for Dad too. I think those three or four ushers who stayed to count the offering, spent more time telling jokes and laughing. Or they sure were slow at counting.

On Sunday mornings when there wasn't a meal in the pressure cooker before leaving for church, I would look in the refrigerator for the bowl with a peanut butter and jelly sandwich on top of the lid. That meant we were going to the park in Silverton for a potluck lunch with mom's cousins and friends. Hooray.

But on a Sunday morning when there was not a meal in the pressure cooker, no bowl with a peanut butter sandwich on top for my little sister, and Dad walked home with us from church, what was happening? I hoped it was not another family visit with their friends who have kids we don't know. Finally, while gathered in the kitchen, Mom started to say - Family afternoon plans for today. . . And Dad said - are for you to decide. Without hardly taking a breath my hand went up in the air, and I shouted - Agate Beach !!!

Mom tucked sandwiches, fruit, and juice into our trusty Scottish Plaid cooler, put some paper plates, cups, napkins, utensils, and snacks into a basket. We loaded the car, but all I needed was my treasure finding bucket. It was a two-and-a-half-hour drive to this 'treasure land', but we were on our way.

Do you know what you can make if you can find small pieces of sticks or driftwood and a nice flat rock? Glue a few pieces together side by side so they are straight across at one end. Make another line of shorter pieces, and glue them to the taller pieces, with all of them straight across at one end. Draw some black dots, two on each stick, like they all have eyes. When dry, glue them standing up on the flat rock, and wa-la you have a Rock Concert.

At that time, Agate Beach had everything a girl with a bucket could hope for. Shells, sea glass, and agates galore. Mom and Dad put up their beach chairs and just watched us in our imagination. My little sister stayed close to them and our dog, but my brother made his version of sandcastles and roads not too far in front of them where the sand was a little moist. Mom always knew what the tides were doing before we got to the beach. And there I was, off in this 'Treasure land' adventure with my bucket in hand. They knew I could be there for hours.

Dad was a collector of rocks too. They lined the shelves and the windowsill in his workshop in the back of the garage. I used to run my fingers over them while he worked. I have his collection here with me now. Maybe to others they are pretty rocks and agates, petrified wood, and a pretty green colored rock with leaf fossils on it, but to me they are memories. And, they come with a story.

I suppose that's why I kept my treasure of rocks and sticks in a shoebox under my bed. Only Mom and Dad knew about those boxes under there. My Sunny Jim jelly jar full of my marbles was hidden there too. My brother was always trying to get me to trade one of my special marbles for his offer of four marbles. I already had the marbles he had, so why would I want four more of the same. He really wanted the one I had called Steeley.

Some gifts don't come wrapped in buttons and bows. Sometimes they come in the small hand of a child holding out a rock chosen just for you. Because in that moment you were the most important person in their world. And long after the rock is tucked into a drawer or a shoebox under the bed, the memory stays. The day. The child. The feeling of being chosen.

Someday soon I hope that space between the sidewalk and the street in front of my house, that looks like the 'garden of weedin', will become a Rock Garden. A place to take a rock, leave a rock, share a rock. It will be a place of painted rock messages and pictures - Beloved, Special, Kind, Smile, Friend, Family, Faith. and many more special words. Smaller rocks for the little hands - puppy paws, hearts, pumpkin faces, snowman faces, Cute, Gentle, Love.

Maybe I can't save the whole world, but I can still make a difference for the people who cross my path wherever that might happen. Sharing treasures, sharing time, a sharing a gift from my heart to yours. Moments that just happen.

Treasures from the heart are a gift everlasting.
