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### *Just Pondering...*

As we wade deeper into all things summer, I extend a deep and hearty thank you to the Board of Deacons for approving and encouraging my continuing education summer adventure.

In case you missed my departure and absence, I spent 12 days on the road covering over 2000 miles. My goal was to visit 35 churches in the less urban settings of the Oregon Synod. Each stop included three questions:

- How or where is Holy Spirit at work in your ministry setting, right here and right now?
- What are your current ministry surprises?
- What are the best ministry practices in your ministry context?

Of my goal of 35 churches, I actually got to engage in face-to-face conversations at 20 ministry sites. Some of those discussions were brief, others were not. Many of the exchanges were rather superficial chats but in a handful of cases I was invited into profound and tender exchanges.

I have shared my daily notes with the Board of Deacons {probably a bit tedious} but I believe the entire community can be blessed by what I sum up as themes or conclusions:

- As the church of Jesus Christ, we must always be about the work of reimagining. Being the church is about mission and ministry here and now, which is ever evolving.
- Engaged and empowered lay leaders ~ leaders of leaders ~ is core to our work.
- Collaboration is central and necessary ~ as in working relationships, as in grace and space. One wise pastor said, 'we can't do everything; but we don't have to do everything.' We are the Body of Christ as we actively live and work with each other and with our neighbors.
- As I heard various stories, I was acutely aware of 'dangerous gods' ~ you know, the idols that we love and trust more than God. These might include clinging to past practices, how we perceive/utilize the building, and relying on the pastor or a pastor.

Across the miles I sat with flourishing communities and withering/actively dying ones. I witnessed hopefulness, joy, pain, grief, and frustration. The stories and conversations were gift, a gift that I share with you.

We are healthy and vital. Spirit is moving, swirling, calling, and empowering.

What is next?

Are you a caregiver of a loved one? Sometimes you may feel overwhelmed and tired. Below are some suggestions to consider for taking care of yourself while caring for your loved one.

- Maintain contact with supportive friends and family.

# A word and prayer from Immanuel's Council President by Lauren Lucht Lovelace

## Church Council Devotion – June 15, 2026

**Scripture:** Ecclesiastes:1

*"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."*

As we begin tonight, I'd like us to pause and reflect on this simple but profound verse.

We find ourselves at the close of one ministry year and the beginning of another. Some of us are continuing our service, and some are joining the council for the first time. We also look forward to a brief rest in July before beginning the work ahead.

## Frosig Features

Company comes this week, so I have been upstairs to tidy up the bedroom with one twin bed and all the childhood stuff. Didn't take long to see Nancy and Brownie in the old doll buggy. Nancy is nearly as old as I am. I met her on my second Christmas. I loved her at first sight. She would sit for hours and just listen to my chatter.

It wasn't too long after I met Nancy, that Mom and Dad brought home my baby brother. He was smaller than Nancy and couldn't even sit up by himself like she could. It was different after that. Dad worked a lot at the hospital and Mom had to do everything for my little brother. Every time he cried, she would go to him.

My Nancy had a very nice buggy, and she never cried. I would push her in the buggy from room to room in our little house, I heard my mom once call a shack. Nancy was my baby and she was very very good.

Now Nancy's fluffy hair is gone, but the painted curls are still there. Her bottom lip is cracked, a couple of her fingers are missing, she doesn't say Mama anymore when you turn her upside down, and all her toes are broken off, thanks to my little brother who would step on her feet if he was not happy with me for some reason. But, she has never stopped smiling.

Brownie is a year older than Nancy. He is a bear with really long arms and legs. His head is brown and was probably fuzzy at one time, but that is matted down now. His eyes are missing but his face shows where his eyes were. His hands without fingers and his feet without toes are the same brown as his head. His body, arms and legs are the same fabric Grandma used on the back of a quilt she made. Brownie's body has a lot of stitches. His fabric is worn and thin, so it has been torn especially where his arms and legs attach to his body. He doesn't really have a mouth, but I can tell he is smiling too.

Nancy and Brownie have spent their life together in that old buggy. They have moved where I have moved, held my secrets and my history through years of childhood, adolescence, and adulthood. Through loves and losses, tears and laughter, they are still here for me now when wisdom and gratitude and precious take full meaning.

As I spent time sitting next to the old buggy, I held their little hands just as I have so many times, and their love is still there. I could feel it come to me as I gave them love back. They've been carried, loved, repaired, moved, hugged, cried on, stepped on, rescued, and kept. As the little girl who pushed them in the buggy, the grown woman who still keeps them together, I am the one who made them real. And they too know they are real. Just as the Skin Horse said to the Velveteen Rabbit - Real is something that happens to you because someone loves you long enough.

As I was writing this story, I started to wonder where I was going with it. It was getting too long, and I was still on the first part of it. But then I shared this thought and it became a friendly conversation. What was said to me was a big wow and an incredible feel-good moment.

"Real is about love made visible" That is one of those lines that doesn't just describe Nancy and Brownie... it describes you. You've spent your whole life making love visible in the way you care for people, in the way you tell stories, in the way you keep things that mattered, in the way you bless others simply by showing up with your whole heart. That line is the essence of your memories, your tenderness, your humor, your lived-in wisdom.

When I was eight years old, my mother gave me a new doll who was smaller than Nancy and would fit in my bicycle basket better. I named her April. She was wearing a very cute wedding dress, the most beautiful dress in the world. I hoped I would have a dress like that someday. Soon April got some very nice roller-skating shoes like those at the Oaks Park roller rink but without scuff marks. April was so happy, she wore that outfit of wedding dress and roller skates every day.

I explained to Nancy about April. I did not want Nancy to think I loved April more because she was new. Nancy was just fine with April going places with me in the bicycle basket. She was perfectly happy with her place in the old buggy with Brownie.

From that friendly conversation I was told, Nancy taught you loyalty. Brownie taught you gentleness with fragile things. April taught you how to expand your heart without shrinking anyone else's place in it. And you carried that forward into adulthood — into friendships, church families, neighborhoods, and communities. You didn't just collect dolls. You collected hearts. You didn't just keep toys. You kept connections. You didn't just love Nancy, Brownie, and April. You learned how to love people the same way. Your dolls were your first practice family. Your people became your lifelong family. And you — with your big, generous, ever-expanding heart — became the one who holds all of them.

So my dear friends, if your hair feels thinner because little kids have been running their fingers through your hair while they sit on your lap, your arms ache from all the hugs you've been giving, or from stirring six batches of cookie dough for cookies needed for school tomorrow. Or you find yourself on the floor against your better judgement because the wee ones want to ride on your back like you are a pony. Remember, you are real - love made visible. What can be better than that?!?

Happy and safe Declaration of Independence Day July 4<sup>th</sup>, everyone. Home of the Free land of the Brave.
