Frosig Features

Passion - An activity, skill, or cause, that excites and motivates. Something that brings joy related to work, hobbies, creativity, and helping others. Natural and energizing.

It's amazing how suddenly a memory can come and bring a story back to life again. Even though my head is full of memories, I am so happy when one just comes. Not too long ago at morning coffee, I mentioned being able to retire early and that my husband had asked me - What will you do with all that extra time? And then he said - Your passion!

Passion 1 came when I was four years old.

I was always ready to go with Dad when he was on call at Providence Hospital. So, if it was an early evening call and not too gory for me to see, he would ask me to go with him. I loved sitting on the counter in the X-ray room next to the light green milkshake machine. Of course, I did not know it made barium drinks. Dad would X-ray broken people, and I would visit with the priests and sisters and doctors and nurses who would come to see me. It was exciting.

One evening, Dad sat me on a stretcher across from the surgery room doors and told me to stay there while he went in to take some x-rays. Soon Dr. Blin came and sat beside me. He asked about my day and then offered me some gum. Yum-m-m. As we chatted, he asked me if I would be his nurse someday. And just like that, my first passion was born. I am going to be a nurse.

I got a Nurse's bag for Christmas, complete with a stethoscope and (candy) pills. Every doll and bear in our house got an exam. As the years went by, high school led me to chemistry, Latin, and physiology. A Home Nursing course was offered by the Red Cross. One summer I volunteered as a Candy Stripper, but at Providence we were called Pinkies. After about 120 hours and experiences of many kinds, my nursing passion slipped away right in the room across from the Admitting office near the Emergency Entrance.

While sitting on a little stool in the records room, I was filing folders into their proper places. Two Ambulance people pushed a stretcher through the Emergency door and left it right outside the door where I was sitting on the stool. They were in the Admitting Room talking to someone, and a doctor came out into the hallway. Then a lady came who was crying and wailing and telling the doctor it wasn't true. But it was true. Her husband did not survive and he was right there above my head. I felt numb and then started to cry too. Finally, someone noticed me and called Dad. My emotions kicked in and what if that happens again.

I asked Dad at dinner how could he be there day after day. He told me, "You learn the skills you need to do your work. Today was hard for you I know, but my sweet girl with your tender heart, maybe a nurse is not what you are meant to be."

Passion 2. Being the editor of our high school yearbook my senior year, I was invited to a Journalism conference at the University of Oregon. I was smitten with this whole idea of writing and the campus and becoming someone new. I had my acceptance and my dorm deposit paid, and then it all fell apart. All about a guy, of course, my high school sweetheart. He was beginning his second year at the University of Oregon, and he had my life/our life all planned out. Did not include that I might date other guys or want girlfriend time. So, I bailed and that passion was over before it had a chance to begin.

My life journey got off track and remained passionless for a long time. I had fun, traveled, worked, had lots of friends, but what was my purpose, my passion. Then I married the right guy for me and that passion did last, it was a gift. Thank you Lord.

Kris and I were married about 12 years when the company I worked for restructured, they called it. My job was gone. Since Kris had retired from the ministry by then, it only made sense that I should stay home and play with him. He proposed that idea and I totally agreed. Then he said, "It's time for you to pursue your passion and have some fun."

So, I did something unexpected. I took a correspondence course, and I became a Doll Doctor. I didn't even cry, my patients were always smiling. It didn't pay much, but it did pay in joy. The look on someone's face when they saw their childhood doll restored was worth more than any paycheck. My husband, with his two master's degrees, laughed one day and said, "I never thought I'd ever learn so much about dolls."

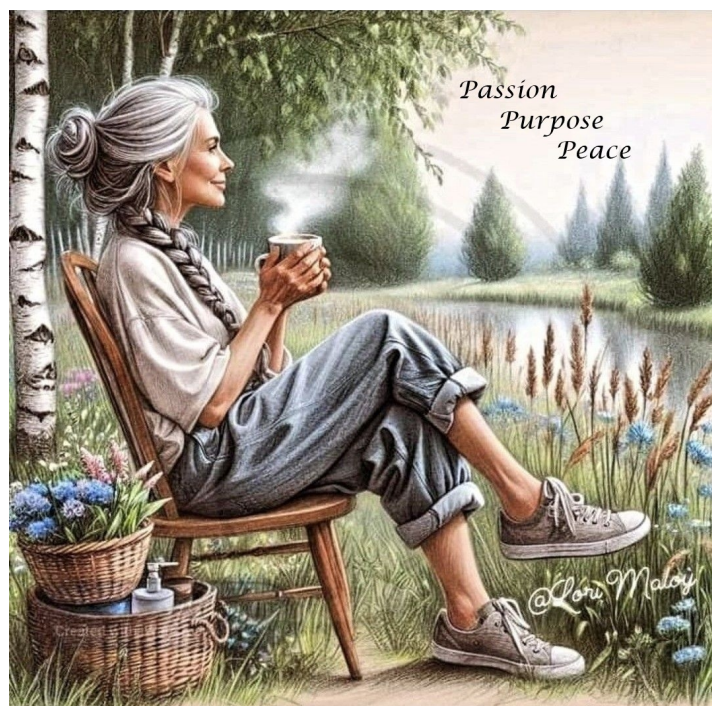
Passions - they don't always become what we expect. But they make us feel alive and curious and connected no matter when they arrive. Natural and energizing.

So maybe, in Kris' last words to me, "I am going now to meet the Lord you have to let me go, and you go to that small town you love so much and do some good", maybe just maybe he knew my next passion would be writing and sharing these stories. Wow, I am a doctor and a writer.
